Minutes of Meeting—June 15, 2015

CKAG welcomed one guest to the meeting, Judy Wilson, living in Fort Knox. Judy is interested in working in watercolor and pen with ink.

Business Exhibits were discussed. It was reported that the Cobbler's Café was closed due to electrical problems, so no transfer of art could happen.

Details regarding the Art Journaling workshop planned by Marilyn Matthews for Saturday, July 25 were shared. That workshop, out of necessity, has since been cancelled.

Mary Lou Hall has agreed to present a program on painting on Yupo during the July meeting. (Yupo is a brand name of a polypropylene surface, which presents a whole new set of variables for watercolor painting).

The bank funds of CKAG have successfully been transferred to The Cecilian Bank, where no monthly fees will be charged.

The committee planning the All Member Show announced that a juror had been selected. Sharon Matisoff has agreed to judge the exhibit. She paints in oils and pastels, often representing human or animal forms. The deadline for entries is August 11. The entry fee will be \$20 for one piece and \$25 to enter two. Signup sheets for various tasks related to the All Member Show were circulated.

There was more discussion about the application of a protective coating to the mural painted by CKAG members. The current concern is how the product might be adversely affected by summer heat.

Three CKAG members were juried into the Guild. Anita Friess, Gwen Yarbrough, and Betty Woodson are now qualified to display their art at the Business Exhibits.

Karen Hart expressed appreciation for the hydrangea sent by CKAG upon the death of her husband.

After the break, artists voted for the Artist of the Month winners. The results are listed on the previous page of the newsletter.

And with the air conditioning not working in Our Place, the program was postponed due to the heat.
