#### THOUGHTS FROM THE CKAG PRESIDENT

The February 2019 issue of Kentucky Living magazine has an article titled, "Amazing Artistry", which talks about Kentucky's rich heritage of arts. A graphic in the article shows an outline of Kentucky with stars for Paducah, Georgetown, Paris, and Berea. For destinations, the article also includes Morehead and Mayfield.

We might quibble about whether the author thoroughly researched Kentucky arts (having omitted Louisville and Lexington, for example), but it wasn't surprising that Elizabethtown and Hardin County weren't mentioned.

CKAG's stated purpose is to promote the arts, but I continue to find long-time local artists who are unaware of any arts organizations in the area. Some of this may be due to cluelessness on their part. Considering that we just had our 25th anniversary, I must put part of the blame on us. As individual artists, we are doing pret-ty well at making art, but I think that we're failing at promoting the arts in general. Promoting arts in general is different, and much harder than promoting physical pieces of art, and requires a different way of thinking.

There is no quick and easy solution to this, but I ask you to start thinking about it as seriously as you do your art. Keep a list where you write down any ideas you have (no matter how outlandish they may seem). Perhaps we can have a brainstorming workshop in April, when the start of spring makes us feel and think livelier.

It would be a good thing for people to think about our region when they think about Kentucky arts.
