Minutes of Meeting-February 18, 2019

The February meeting was called to order at 6:53 p.m. by President Tom Hammett with 11 members present making a quorum for voting.

Correction to the January minutes: The dates for Kentucky Crafted the Market are March 15-17, 2019. A motion to approve the minutes as corrected was made by Mary Lou Hall and seconded by Phyllis Blakeman. Motion was approved.

President Tom Hammett reported a balance of \$2,247.48 in the Treasury.

Mary Lou reported that we have a new business for displaying artwork. Associates of Dermatology on North Dixie will be accepting art. They would like a display of a Kentucky themed work. Since the business is new, we will hear more about the details for displaying work later.

Radcliff Tourism Center has 4 places available for art, and Joyce Lupresto volunteered to fill those spots. The Cecilian Bank has 8 available spots. Mary Lou will solicit the membership via e-mail to fill those. Another venue requesting a display of art from CKAG is the Larue County Library, Hodgenville, Kentucky. Along with displaying art, the library requests the artist give a presentation at their monthly meetings on the 1st Thursday of each month. Tom Hammett will be presenting his art in May. A sign up sheet was circulated among members present for volunteering to present and display art.

Resolution: The Saturday workshop will be year round on the Saturday before the scheduled CKAG monthly meeting.

Discussion followed: Joyce stated that the workshops build comradery among members. Everyone enjoys the interaction it brings with each other through the learning experiences. All members felt that the workshops should be open to the public. If the Saturday workshop requires a live model, it was decided that CKAG members would give \$5 each toward the model's time and expenses.
