#### Minutes of Meeting-June 17, 2019

President Tom Hammett called the meeting to order at 6:36 p.m. There were 12 members present, no visitors.

The motion was made by Elsie Hall to accept the minutes from the May 20 meeting. Theresa Shelton seconded and motion was accepted unanimously.

**Treasury:** Our balance is \$2,132.48 plus \$30 for membership dues received.

**Business Exhibits:** Tom has attempted to visit our displays at the Associates of Dermatology.
