Program: We will have a live model so bring your art supplies.


Artist of Month Theme: Open

CKAG members viewed the exhibit and judged the artwork on various criteria. After much discussion, the following students were awarded 1-3 place and an honorable mention.




"In the Stars" by Norea Watson (1st Place)

MEETING MINUTES: January 15, 2022

President Mary Lou Hall called the meeting to order at 11:07 am. There were 12 members present. This meeting was after Paula Haynes' hands-on demonstration of Negative Space Painting that began at 10 a.m. and before the group set up to judge the Student Art Exhibit.

Comments from the President:

Special thanks to Debbye for supporting CKAG as President for the last 2 years. CKAG would not have survived Covid and a lack of volunteers if she hadn't have stepped up and filled several roles for the group. Special thanks to those who volunteered for CKAG positions this year. Thanks to Juanita for all she does for the group.

III. WEBSITE: Website is active. No further report.

IV. BUSINESS EXHIBITS: Debbye reports nothing is changing this month. Business Exhibits will change March 21. If any juried member wants to be a part of the Business Exhibits, please contact Debbye.

V. PROGRAMS/WORKSHOPS: After discussion, the programs to be conducted in conjunction with the CKAG meetings for the next few months will be as follows: February 2022—Live Drawing; March 2022—Kim Mann presents oil pastels, and April 2022—Watercolor Hacks (tips & tricks). For the April program, members should bring in palettes and gadgets they use for watercolor, and show the group any kind of tip or hack they use in their technique and process.

Workshop discussion included a May workshop by Joyce Lupresto—presenting soft pastels. The following are tentative details: Saturday, May 14 from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Bring own supplies. \$40 per person and open to the public. Paula noted that Sandy Hester may be available in the summer to provide a workshop on painting loosely. Mary Lou suggested a "big event" at Our Place. Paula suggested Larry Elmore presenting oil painting. Paula agreed to contact Larry to find out if he would be available for a program.

VI. OTHER BUSINESS: Paula made a motion to have March's CKAG meeting on a Saturday, like January and February, since the days are still shorter, and we have members who can't drive at night. Debbye seconded the motion and all were in favor. March's meeting will be March 12 at 10 a.m. (*Continued on Page 5*)

Paula made a motion to have a Junior Membership for high school aged youth. Anna Miserendino seconded the motion and all were in favor. Junior Membership affords high school aged youth all the benefits of the Guild (except Business Exhibits), their own category (paying half the entry fee) in the All Member Show, competition alongside all other members in the Artist of the Month and a discounted \$15 annual fee. Kim volunteered to write the amendment to the CKAG Bylaws to be ready for the next business meeting.

Paula asked if fiber artists should be included in CKAG. Points discussed included: a lack of fiber art knowledge in the Guild body, the opportunity to include another medium and the artists it may bring, Kathy Loomis (prior AMS judge) is a fabric artist. Sharon Milliner of Mt. Washington is a good POC to possibly help get a fabric artist guild started. CKAG could assist in helping get a fabric artist guild started. Some members wanted to include fabric artists and some were hesitant. All agreed to "stick a pin in it" and give it some research and thought. Members should consider it and it will be discussed again in the next meeting.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO BYLAWS

Article III—Membership

Section 1. General Membership in the **Central Kentucky Art Guild, Inc.** shall be open to anyone 18 years of age or older who is interested in the fine arts and in furthering the aims and ideals of the **Guild**. Junior Membership shall be open to any central Kentucky high school student (age 14-18) who is interested in the fine arts and in furthering the aims and ideals of the **Guild**.

Section 2. General Members whose annual dues have been paid in full are eligible to participate in all activities of monthly meetings sponsored by the *Guild*, to vote in the general meetings, to hold office, and to serve on committees. They shall receive the monthly newsletter (excluding January and February), membership roster, and all published notifications of exhibit opportunities sponsored by the *Guild*.

Section 3. Junior Members whose annual dues have been paid in full are eligible to participate in all activities of monthly meetings sponsored by the *Guild*. They shall receive the monthly newsletter and membership roster.

Article IV—Annual Dues

Section 1. Annual General membership dues shall be Thirty (\$30) Dollars. Dues are not pro-rated if joining for a partial year. Junior membership dues shall be Fifteen (\$15) Dollars.

I also inserted (and March) in Article III Section 3. Do we want to add a committee for the Area High School Art Show? We will review and vote on the changes at the February meeting.
