Then in the fall we will be recruiting officers and chairpersons for 2023. Consider which office or committee position you might be interested in volunteering.

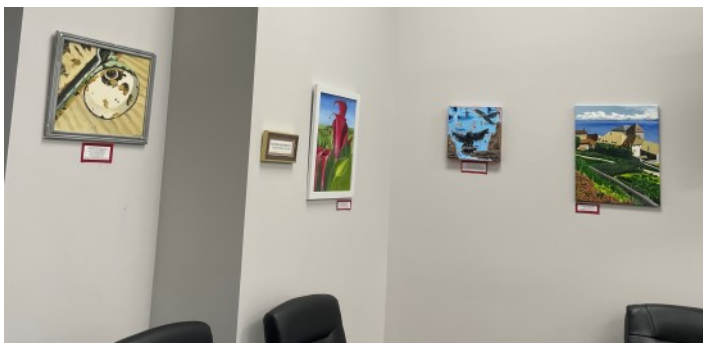

MEETING MINUTES: March 21, 2022

President Mary Lou Hall called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m.. There were 15 members present, including new member Sharon Novak. There were no visitors. NOTE: The group was meeting on the 3rd Monday instead of the second Saturday in March because of snow.

- I. TREASURY: The ending balance in February was \$2,393.05.
- II. MEMBERSHIP: There are currently 29 members consisting of 4 junior members, 23 regular members and 2 honorary members.
- III. WEBSITE: No report.
- IV. BUSINESS EXHIBITS: Paula Haynes asked if anyone else was hanging at Home of Philanthropy, as there are open spots available. Joyce Lupresto volunteered to hang there as well. Karen Callahan mentioned she did not get her painting (February-Artist of the Month) hung in the space at The Cecilian Bank-Oaklawn Branch because there was some confusion as to where that was located. She suggested providing new members a card explaining exactly where the Artist of the Month exhibit space is and the protocol for hanging the piece.
- V. PROGRAMS/WORKSHOPS: The programs to be conducted in conjunction with the CKAG meetings for the next few months will be as follows: April 2022—Watercolor Hacks (Tips & Tricks); May 2022—Dyann Joyce will provide a multimedia demonstration; and June 2022—Paula Haynes and Debbye Hassell are showing folks how to make their own pochade box (a box that often holds paint supplies and acts as an easel). June’s program Paula recommended attendees bring their own “set up” for plein air sessions.

Ideas for other workshops: Mary Lou offered to conduct a beginner’s watercolor workshop if there was interest. One member showed interest. And others mentioned the junior members might really benefit from it. Paula said she talked to Larry Elmore about doing a workshop and he recommended a 1-day workshop for \$100. He could show his painting techniques and other oil painting tips, or help folks finish up a piece. Everyone is thinking on it. Paula still plans on offering a workshop on making magazine journals.

CKAG will offer a soft pastel workshop by Joyce Lupresto on Saturday, May 14 from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Bring your own supplies (Joyce will provide a list). Charge will be \$40 per person.

- VI. OLD BUSINESS: Bylaw Amendment—The group voted in favor of finalizing the Bylaws with added agreed upon changes. Changes included Junior Membership additions and the insertion of “and March” to Article III Section 3. Mary Lou mentioned the Bylaws do not prohibit fiber artists from joining the Guild; therefore, in the future fiber “fine” artists are welcome to join as it is an acceptable medium.
- VII. NEW BUSINESS: Mary Lou recommended an ad hoc committee be formed to begin planning for the High School Art Exhibit. Paula Haynes, Dyann Joyce, and Kim Mann volunteered to be the committee.

Mary Lou asked members if they would be interested in having a booth at West Point on June 18.

Mary Lou also recommended placing a cap on the pay rate for our live models. Anna Miserendino made a motion to cap the live model pay at \$20 per hour. Members will pay \$5 each live model session. Any additional monies received will be set aside to use for future live model events when there are fewer Guild members participating. Joyce seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Mary Lou asked members if they were still interested in planning a gathering every Second Saturday and everyone agreed they wanted to continue. Therefore, Saturday, April 9 there will be a live model life drawing session. \$5 per person. Then on Saturday, May 14 Joyce will present her soft pastel workshop at \$40 per person.

Artist of the Month: Dyann Joyce (1st place), Paula Haynes (2nd place), with Anna Miserendino and Marilyn Matthews tied for (3rd place).

The meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m.
