MINUTES OF MEETING—November 21, 2022

The meeting started at 6:30 p.m. with the program given by Paula Haynes who showed a video of lan Roberts' Five Fundamentals to Composition: 1. Focus on the Principles—why we do what we are doing (example: why do we use thumbnails)?; 2. Deliberate Practice; 3. Challenging Practice; 4. Dance of Avoidance—notice it and overcome it, better a done piece than a good one; 5. Self-Evaluation by learning to critique others and seeing work objectively. Ian Roberts provides a "Mastering Composition Course".

President, Mary Lou Hall, opened up the business portion of the meeting after the program. There were 11 members and no visitors.

- I. **TREASURY**: The ending balance as of October 31, 2022, was \$2,014.65.
- II. **MEMBERSHIP:** No new members to report.
- III. **WEBSITE**: No report.
- IV. **BUSINESS EXHIBITS:** The Business Exhibits should change on December 19 as follows: Paula Decker-Haynes will move to the Associates of Dermatology. Dyann Joyce will hang in Hammer & VanZant Dentistry office, Karen Callahan will hang at the Hardin County Public Library, and George Bauer will take the Home of Philanthropy. Debbye will call Carl McKinley about hanging at The Cecilian Bank.
- V. **PROGRAMS/WORKSHOPS:** Workshops: Mary Lou volunteered to provide a workshop (Watercolor on Yupo Paper) after the January meeting and second Saturday, January 14 at 10 a.m. and the "thumbnail critiques".
- VI. **OLD BUSINESS:** We will not have a program in December but there will be snacks. Members should bring finger foods and a small piece of art for a gift exchange. Tina Perkins-Draper volunteered to do the art gift exchange program during the Christmas meeting.

CKAG will meet on the 2nd Saturday per the Bylaws as follows: January 14, February 11 and March 11.

Aspiring Young Artist Exhibit: Art should be delivered on January 14, 2023, from 10-12 p.m. The exhibit will be on Saturday, January 21, 2023, from 4-8 p.m. Members who were contacting local high schools were able to get out to their respective schools again to remind art teachers of the Art Exhibit opportunity. Debbye Hassell volunteered to draft a letter to be sent to the area high schools to remind art teachers of the deadline to enter (December 20) and the framing requirements. Juanita volunteered to print and send the letters.

The Art Envelope exchange will start back in January. Members who are interested should sign up with Debbye who volunteered to run the exchange again for the group.

Dyann Joyce informed the members that the Elizabethtown Art in the Park judging was successful. She agreed to post the winners once she has confirmed with Ashley Brown (the POC) that the winners have already been announced. Medals were bought by CKAG and provided to each winner.

On Saturday, November 12, the group met for a Second Saturday live drawing session. Seven people, including one guest, showed up for the session. It was very successful.

VII: **NEW BUSINESS:** Thumbnail critique group: During the lan Roberts program, he mentioned practicing thumbnails as a way to develop composition for an art piece, focusing on big shapes/ tones/focal point. At least five people in the group expressed interest in practicing and possibly having others in the group critique the thumbnails to improve the skill. The group agreed to work on a thumbnail sketch to bring to the next meeting. Critiques will be conducted after the meeting and before the workshop on January 14, 2023.

Mary Lou announced the 2023 "non-elected" CKAG officers: Website: Theresa Shelton, Publicity: Dyann Joyce, Programs/Workshops: Marilyn Matthews, Historian/Artist of the Month: Karen Hart, Business Exhibits: Paula Cohn, Newsletter/Membership: Juanita McCoy. Mary Lou then announced the following slate of elected officers:

President: Paula Decker-Haynes, Vice President: Debbye Hassell, Treasurer: Juanita McCoy, Secretary: Kim Mann. There were no other nominee submissions. Debbye made a motion that all nominees be accepted as a slate and Tina seconded the motion. Everyone was in favor of the slate of nominees.

Artist of the Month themes are as follows: January: Fire & Ice, March: Abstract; May: Animal, July: Watercolor Technique (try something new), September: Pen & Ink, November: Light & Shadow. Months not mentioned are considered "Open" and members can submit any piece they want.

Meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
