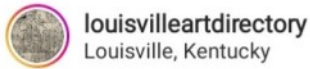

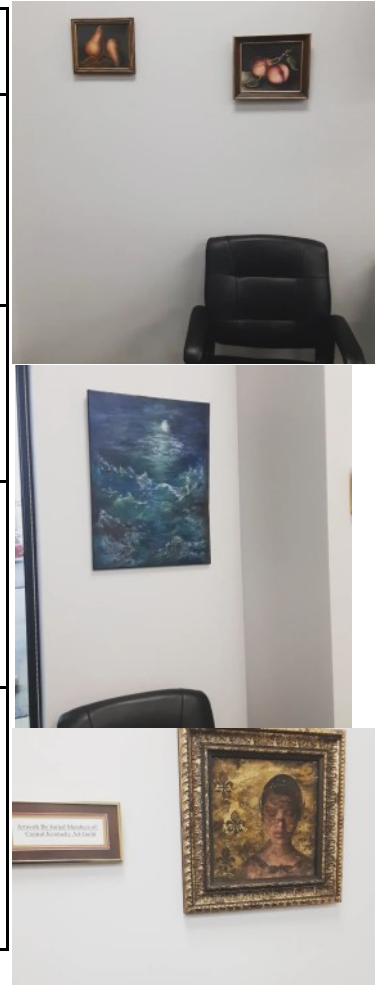

MINUTES OF MEETING—March 11, 2023

President, Paula Decker-Haynes, called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. Twelve people were present including one visitor (Melinda Langley who works in acrylics and later joined.)

The Treasurer's report shows a balance of \$2,223.96 as of February 28, 2023. Total membership was 27 members, 3 being junior members and 2 honorary.

PROGRAMS/WORKSHOPS: Marilyn Matthews informed the group of upcoming programs and workshops:

- Monday, April 17—Joyce Lupresto presents plein air supplies and preparation
- Monday, July 17—Debbye Hassell presents pen and ink

Workshops will be as follows:

- Saturday, April 22--Paper clay (sculpting a fennec fox head) by Dyann Joyce, 10-2 pm, \$15 each, supplies will be provided
- Saturday, May 13—Plein air painting with Joyce Lupresto from 10-2 pm at the Veterans Memorial at Freeman Lake in Elizabethtown (no cost, bring your own supplies).

A program or workshop on alcohol ink may be held in either May or June.

OLD BUSINESS: There was a brief discussion about how to write some of the details of junior membership into the Constitution—specifically, submissions for Artist of the Month. With only 3 junior members, they don't have the numbers for their own Artist of the Month display and voting block, so until that occurs, displaying with the general membership may be the way to encourage them to stay involved. How their points would be distributed has yet to be determined.

Debbye Hassell suggested attending the Arts & Materials Expo at Preston's Art Supply in Louisville as a field trip for the Guild. As of right now, it will take place in the summer. A definite date has yet to be determined.

Dyann Joyce suggested we look for more places to display and will send a list of new locations to Paula Cohn. Dyann mentioned tourist art-and-bourbon themed paintings for John O's. George Bauer said he will ask if they will accept paintings at his old office (now a part of Baptist Health). Items we will need to consider are how many paintings can hang in the space, will they adhere to our schedule, and would they expect a percentage of any artwork sold.
