MINUTES OF MEETING—March 9, 2024

CKAG President, Paula Haynes, opened the meeting at 11 a.m. Prior to the meeting, the group talked about art journals for the program. Several members brought in their own art journals and art journaling magazines for display. The group engaged in a hearty discussion about the various ways members use art journaling. Guest, Candy Morris, provided creative ways to inspire art journaling to include a list of prompts, materials to use, and other art journaling inspirations.

MEMBERSHIP/ATTENDANCE: Eleven members attended with four guests: Gaylene Lacefield Candy Morris, Rane & William (Bill) Sessions. At the end of the meeting, Gaylene, Rane & Bill all completed an application and paid their membership dues. Welcome to our newest members! Joyce Lupresto volunteered to deliver the forms and dues to Juanita. NOTE: We need more membership applications at Our Place.

TREASURY: The current CKAG balance is \$1,971.17. Income received: \$105 membership dues. Expenses were \$175 for high school awards and \$7.39 for website fees.

WEBSITE: Nothing was reported.

BUSINESS EXHIBITS: Paula explained that the Business Exhibits will change on March 18. Those artists currently displaying their art are:

Workshops: At the next meeting, Paula will collect the participant list for the "Personality Doll" Workshop, scheduled for June 24, 2024, and provide a supply list. She confirmed the price is \$25.

Future Workshops: Marilyn is considering Martin Rollins (oil pastels) and Kate Esser (alcohol ink) for future workshops. Members should go to martinrollins.net to see more about him.

PUBLICITY:

Malinda Sieg reported three ways to submit information to The News Enterprise and local publicity. She announced that the newspaper is planning to cover the Artist of the Year either by interviewing Marilyn or being at the event (or both).

OLD BUSINESS:

Aspiring High School Artists Exhibit: The group agreed to send out the results to the high schools (like we did the invitations) by revising the letter to include the names of schools that participated, the number of entries, and the winners (place, name, school).

Things to consider next year: nametags, music, sign in book with date/email spots. A recommendation was to have the show open for 2 days. We will reconsider as we get closer to the event next year to see if there is manpower for it. Another recommendation was if we get the same number of participants or more, we should judge each medium and provide place ribbons. For mediums with minimal entries, we could consider a catch all/miscellaneous category.

Hosting an art show/gallery throughout the year. The group agreed it is a lot of work. Malinda Sieg volunteered to head up a committee to explore this possibility and report back next meeting.

ARTIST OF THE YEAR: Marilyn's exhibit is March 18-April 12. Opening reception is March 22 from 5-7 p.m. A food/beverage sign up sheet was passed around among members.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

George Bauer has art displayed at Tony York's restaurant in Glendale, and sold a landscape piece. Theresa Shelton also has artwork displayed there. George also brought his wood worked ornamental bird houses to the meeting for display.

Next month's meeting will be on Monday, April 15 at 6:30 p.m. The 2nd Saturday will be April 13 and the group agreed to congregate at 10 a.m. for a "Come and Art Together'. Members can come to Our Place with their supplies to do their own art for a couple hours.

Mary Lou has expressed that she would like to host another 2nd Saturday plein air event at her home soon. The group agreed May or June would be better for weather and temperatures. Thanks Mary Lou!
