MINUTES OF MEETING—September 16, 2024

CKAG President, Paula Haynes, opened the meeting at 7 p.m. Fourteen people were present with no visitors. There was no art critique.

TREASURY: The current CKAG balance as of August 30, 2024, was \$2060.23. Income was \$430 from the AMS entries and expenses were \$50 for the newsletter, \$150 for the judge for the AMS, and \$22.99 for the web hosting fee. All Member Show financial report showed entry fees of \$470 with expenses: Judge \$150, Programs \$55.97, Awards \$380 generating a loss of \$115.97.

WEBSITE: Theresa Shelton described migrating the CKAG website from Host Gator to Blue Host. Some of the pictures were lost and some of the links don't work, but she will be working on it.

BUSINESS EXHIBITS: Business Exhibits changed on September 16. The following artists will have their work on display from Sept 16 to Dec 16.

Mary Lou Hall—Home of Philanthropy

Mary Lou led a discussion about current businesses CKAG utilizes and how much exposure the pieces actually get. Specifically the CKAG art in the Home of Philanthropy is hung in the basement and is only seen by meeting members, whereas the CKAG art hung in The Cecilian Bank gets ample exposure. She talked with the staff of Hardin County Library about getting our artwork back into the library. She is waiting to speak with the library manager about using the wall space in the back of the library. Other ideas mentioned was Tony York's restaurant in Glendale and the Brown-Pusey House in Elizabethtown. Members should continue to seek out potential business exhibition areas.

OLD BUSINESS:

High School Art Exhibit: Paula Decker Haynes and Tina Perkins-Draper met prior to the meeting to discuss the way ahead for the high school exhibit. Paula requested that another member volunteer to help the committee and Cassandra Carroll volunteered. Tentative show date is February 22, 2025.

Preservation of Art Panels in Elizabethtown: Cassandra Carroll updated the group. She asked if the group would permit a change of title from “restoration committee” to “conservation committee”. She found that monies are available for conservation but not for preservation. She volunteered to write a grant request from the Kentucky Arts Council to augment funds required to do the repair work on the art panels. Cassandra also recommended we work now to get the funds with a goal to start the work in the spring when we can open the doors for ventilation in the large room next to Our Place. The group agreed.

ARTIST OF THE MONTH: Members brought several pieces. The theme was “Historical”.

1st place—G.A. Wells and Rane Sessions

2nd place—Cassandra Carroll

Members should begin generating ideas for artist of the month themes next year. Everyone agreed to put historical artists in a hat and pull one and have everyone bring in a piece of that style as one theme “historical artist hat pull”.

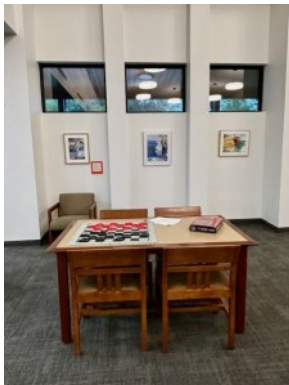
